Germany's Confrontation with the Holocaust in a Global Context is an outreach project led by the German Department at the University of Leeds, with the South African Holocaust and Genocide Foundation and the National Holocaust Centre and Museum.

The outcomes are an exhibition; a drama by Escape Contemporary Youth Theatre with the Theatre Company Blah Blah Blah; a catalogue; and an education pack:

The exhibition explores Germany's evolving response to the Holocaust since 1945 and draws parallels to other global contexts. It explores how nations and individuals confront traumatic histories, asking *why* and *how* we remember the past.

The exhibition launches at Leeds Town Hall on 19 January 2015 and then at Parkinson Court, University of Leeds, on 26 January 2015. It will also launch on 27 January 2015 at the Cape Town Holocaust Centre and the UK National Holocaust Centre and Museum.
